


Wyoming

Wyoming became the 44th state of the USA in 1890. It is the ninth largest state in area, with farming and mining being its major industries. The Rocky Mountains cover about two thirds of Wyoming and most of the huge Yellowstone National Park is within the state.

The name Wyoming comes from the indian word meaning 'on the great plain'. Cheyenne is the state capital and largest city.
